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AIDS education helps to reduce stigma and discrimination

HIV and AIDS education for young people plays a vital role in global efforts to end the AIDS epidemic. Despite the fact that HIV transmission can be prevented, each year hundreds of thousands of young people become infected with the virus.

Providing young people with basic AIDS education enables them to protect themselves from becoming infected. Young people are often particularly vulnerable to sexually transmitted HIV, and to HIV infection as a result of drug-use. Acquiring knowledge and skills encourages young people to avoid or reduce behaviours that carry a risk of HIV infection. Even for young people who are not yet engaging in risky behaviours, AIDS education is important for ensuring that they are prepared for situations that will put them at risk as they grow older.

AIDS education also helps to reduce stigma and discrimination, by dispelling false



information that can lead to fear and blame. This is crucial for prevention, as stigma often makes people reluctant to be tested for HIV and individuals that are unaware of their HIV infection are more likely to pass the virus on to others.

The Indian scenario

In India, where young people represent a large proportion of the country's population, an estimated 2.4 million people are living with HIV. In phase II of the country's National AIDS Control Programme, the Adolescent Edu-

cation Programme (AEP) was launched. The programme aimed to train teachers and peer educators to educate the student community both in and out of school about life skills, HIV prevention and HIV related stigma and discrimination. Under the initiative 112,000 schools were covered and 288,000

teachers were trained.

However, there is a discrepancy, between the large amount of effort invested in HIV/AIDS curricula and training packages on a national level, and the lack of actual education being carried out in many schools. In the states of the country where there is a relatively low HIV prevalence, officials

Novel features of the ASTICON 2012 included an All India Essay Competition for Medical (UG & PG) Students on the topic "Removal of social stigma on STD & AIDS" and a STD/AIDS Quiz for Medical Post Graduates with attractive cash prizes. Informative panel discussions and poster presentations on STD/AIDS were other features that stimulated great interest among the audience. There were two Award Paper Sessions and the best three scientific papers in each session were given awards.

Important papers on HIV/AIDS presented at the conference were "Thirty years of AIDS - lessons learnt and future challenges" by Dr JK Maniar, Consultant in HIV Medicine, Jaslok Hospital & Research Centre, Mumbai; "Management of ART-experienced patients of more than 10 yrs by DG Saple, Director HIV Clinical Research Programme, Human Health Care & Research Foundation, Mumbai; "Treat and Cure HIV early" by Dr R Sajith Kumar, Chief of Infectious Diseases, Govt Medical College Hospital, Kottayam and "Current status of initiation of ART in HIV infected patients" by Dr OC Abraham, Professor of Medicine, Christian Medical College, Vellore.

Dr AD Dharmaratnam, organising Chairman of ASTICON in an earlier interview with Pharmabiz had pointed out that India is well on its way to halt and reverse the epidemic in India over the next five years. At the hospital level, there is a high degree of awareness about universal precautions while handling blood and biological fluids. The affordability and widespread free availability of Anti Retroviral Therapy has empowered Indian doctors to manage the disease just like other lifelong diseases such as diabetes.

According to him hospitals should take initiatives to prevent infections through better coverage of high-risk groups with targeted interventions, provide greater care, support and treatment to large number of people living with HIV/AIDS (PLHA) and strengthen the infrastructure, systems and human resources.



have been reluctant to encourage AIDS education, claiming that the problem is not significant enough in these areas to warrant a widespread educational response. In reality, it is crucial that young people learn about AIDS in areas with a low prevalence so that the prevalence stays low.

ASTICON 2012

In this context the just-concluded 36th National Conference of Sexually Transmitted Diseases and AIDS (ASTICON 2012) at Kochi with the theme of "Past, present and future of STD's and AIDS" is quite relevant.

With declining numbers of STD and HIV, there is a tendency on the part of the younger generation of medical professionals to overlook them during and after their training. ASTICON 2012 effectively bridged this gap by bringing in senior faculty both to recount their experiences as well as learn about the future projections.

More than 300 doctors from all parts of India and over 40 faculty members who were experts in the field of STD & HIV medicine, general medicine, gynaecology, paediatrics, lab sciences, psychiatry, forensic and sexual medicine participated in the event.

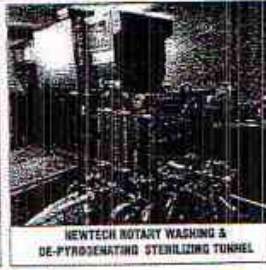

Report of the Workshop on Practical Training in Community Medicine for Under Graduate Medical students conducted at SNIMS on 23-04-2012.

The workshop was organized with an idea to get consensus on uniform pattern of training methodologies and conduct of examination for undergraduate Medical students in Community Medicine. The programme was organized and conducted by the joint venture of the Department of Community Medicine, SNIMS and Indian Public Health Association, Kerala Branch. Information was given to the Principals and Head of the Departments of Community Medicine in all the 22 Medical Colleges in the state. Prior sanction was obtained from the Director of Medical Education, Kerala and communicated to all Medical Colleges. The information was also given to Registrar and Assistant Registrar (Academic) of Kerala University of Health Sciences. Representatives from 13 Medical colleges participated in the workshop. Other Medical Colleges could not participate due to MCI inspection / University Inspection / HS strike.

The programme started at the council hall of SNIMS with prayer. After a brief introduction by Dr. Raju Antony, HOD Community Medicine, SNIMS ~~Commander~~ **Dr. M.J. John**, Principal, SNIMS addressed the gathering. He emphasized the need for uniformity in training of Medical students not only in Community Medicine but also in other subjects. **Dr. K.V. Beena**, DPM, NRHM of Ernakulam Dist inaugurated the workshop by lighting the traditional lamp. She stated that the NRHM is actively involved in many public health programmes and in coordinating National Health Programmes through both Government and Private health sectors. She expressed her desire to work in tandem and help medical colleges to train the medical students in primary health care. In his felicitation, **Dr. P.J. Vincent**, Medical Superintendent appreciated the efforts taken by the Department of Community Medicine in organizing the workshop. Dr. Saritha Susan Varghese, Asst. INTRODUCTORY SESSION

She expressed her concern about frequent changes in the curriculum by KUHS. She was of the opinion that it will be useful to have Minimum essential standards for contents and methodologies for theory and practical training and this can avoid disparities among medical colleges.

This can be arranged according to the local situations and feasibility. During discussion some of the faculty members raised the difficulties faced by them to visit the government institutions.

THIRD SESSION

This session was chaired by **Dr. E.R. Indira Devi**, HOD. Dept. Community Medicine, Pushpagiri Medical College, Thiruvalla. **Dr.C.R.Saju**, Associate Professor, Amala Medical College, Thrissur presented the topic – Epidemiological exercises and Research Methodology. He explained the need and possibility of practical training in epidemiological exercises and research methodology.

FOURTH SESSION

This session was chaired by **Dr. Indira Murali and Dr. V.D. Manjula**, Professor, Community Medicine, Medical College, Kottayam, presented the topic – Training on Clinico Social Case Studies and First Aid. She opined that mannequins will be of great help in training students in CPR. Some topics on First Aid can be used for OSPE eg; Using triangular bandage for a suspected fracture of forearm and how to tie a reef knot. During the discussion, questions were raised on whether real life cases in the wards could be utilized for practical examination. But majority of the faculty members expressed their concern over using real cases for examination due to the time and manpower shortage.

FIFTH SESSION

This session was chaired by **Dr. Jeeshha C Haran** and the topic – community based teaching was presented by **Dr. Sairu Philip**, Addl.Professor, TD Medical College, Alapuzha. She gave a detailed account of community based learning presently going on in different Medical colleges. She gave an example of project on Pain & Palliative care.

Group Work

After this participants were divided into 4 groups and each group was given topics for discussion. Groups were asked to identify topics given to them as Should be included / Compulsory, Useful / Maybe included, Useful / Can be included if Time permits, Need not be Included. A Performa was given for their use to be returned after discussion and presentation.

In the presentation of group work representative from each group presented their opinion and it was discussed by all in detail and modifications were made after getting consensus. This session was chaired by **Dr.Sbobha.A.** HOD Community Medicine TD Medical College, Alapuzha and **Dr. Deepak**, from Karuna Medical College.

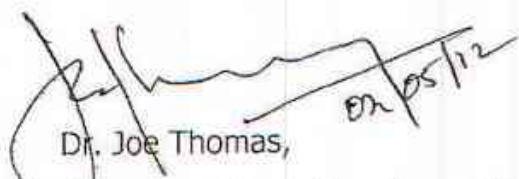

WORLD TB DAY OBSERVATION 24th MARCH 2012

24th March is observed as World Tuberculosis Day in commemoration of the discovery of Tubercle bacilli by Robert Koch in 24th March 1882.

Tuberculosis is still a major public health problem in many of the developing countries including India. 20% of the global burden of T.B is in India. DOTS strategy in RNTCP is a promise in the treatment of tuberculosis.

If a pulmonary tuberculosis patient is left untreated in the community for one year, another 10-15 cases will be produced within that period. Hence the effective control of TB can be achieved only by complete treatment of the cases in the community.

As a part of observation of World T.B Day, Department of Community Medicine, Sree Narayana Institute of Medical Sciences jointly with IMA North Paravur branch organized and conducted public meetings, health education program in the community and in the college and Quiz programme for Medical Students on 24th March 2012.

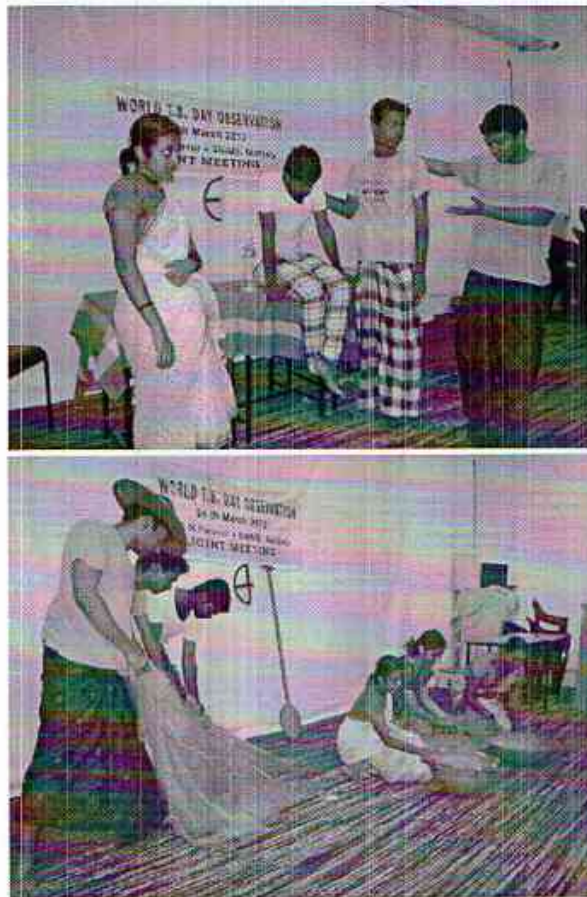

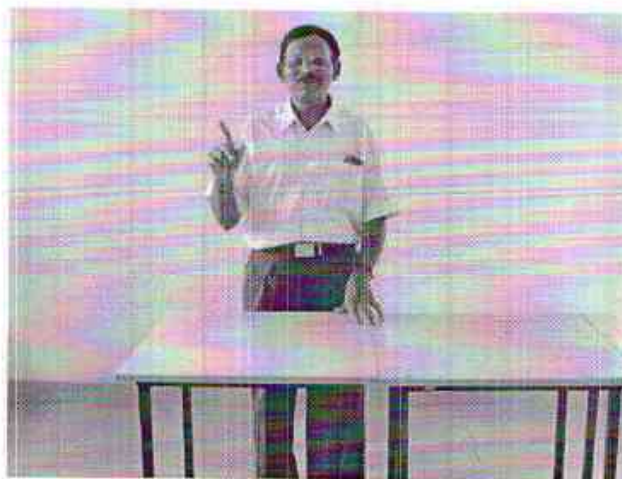


Apart from the speeches by various teachers, the students have conducted role play on TB and its control which was appreciated by all.

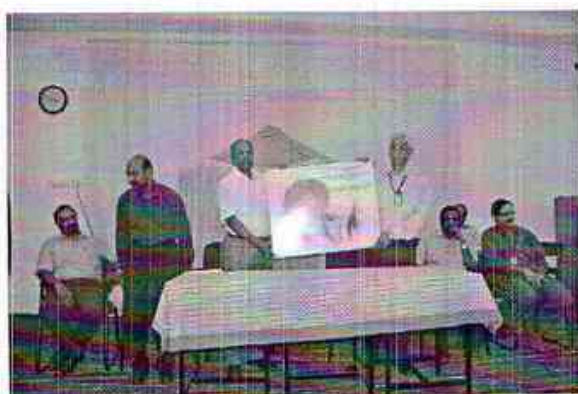

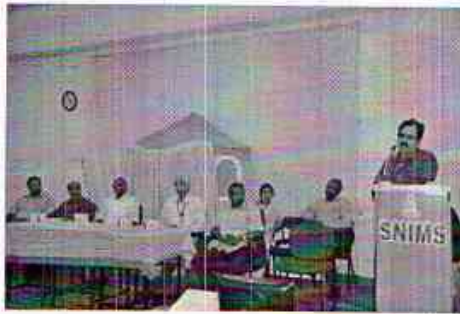

A SHORT REPORT

During the next 20 years, the number of elderly is going to double which would make India the country with the largest number of elderly in the world. In this context, the medical problems of a large group of elderly would create a public health problem in the country.

There are about 3.7 crore people affected by Alzheimer's disease in India. The prevalence of the disease [in India] is said to be one in 20 for people over 60 years, and one in 5 for people over 80 years.

The community aspects were highlighted by Dr P Gopalakrishnan and Prof Dr Raju Antony gave felicitations.

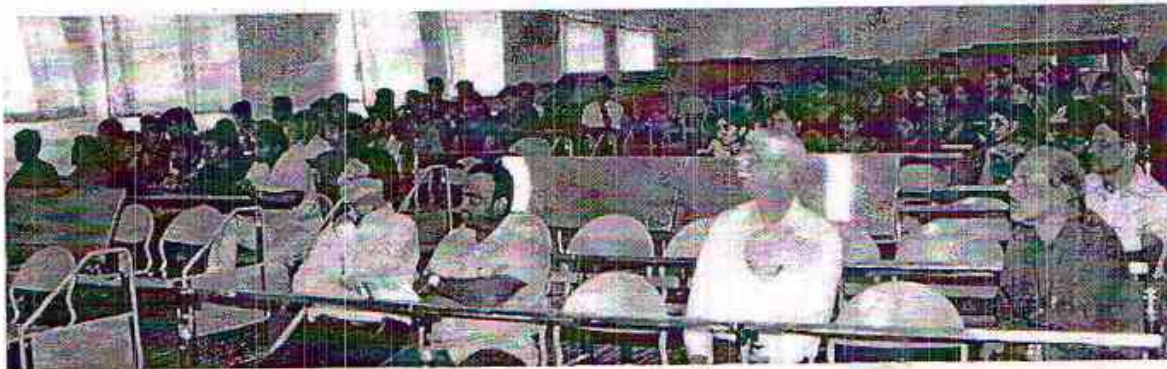

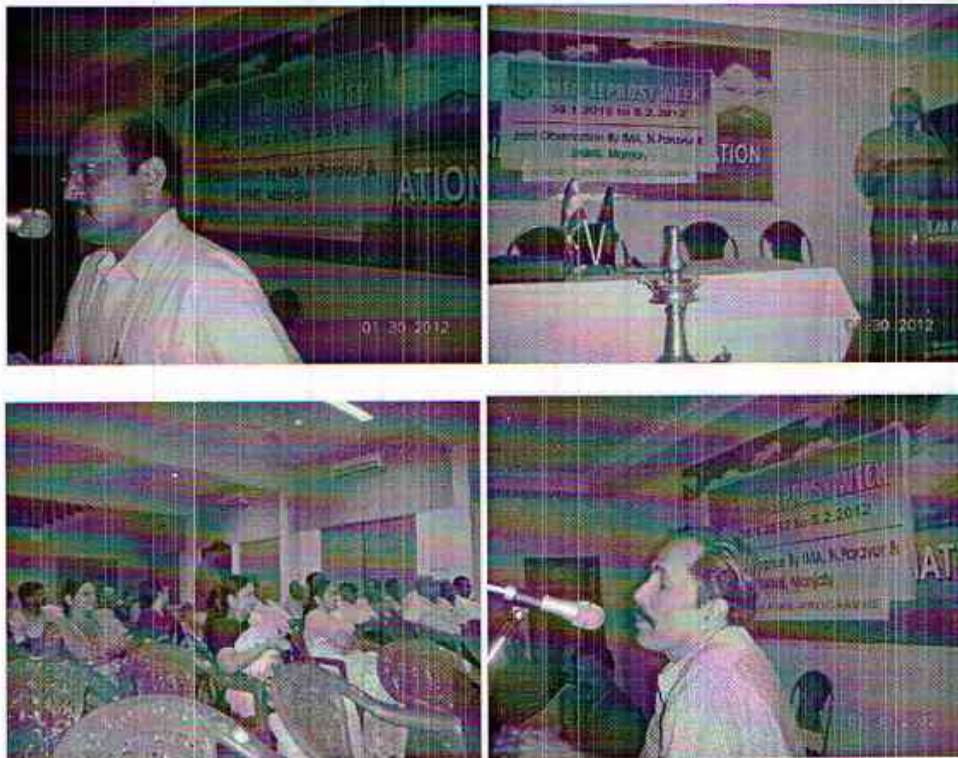
